## 2019 Budget Update

Over the past 9 weeks, the finance team, with input from the other teams, has reviewed the 2016-2018 budgets. During this process teams cut parts of their budgets and requested new money to support new programs. Once the teams put their requests in, the finance team looked at income sources to support the requests. This year, we are happy to be able to support 3 new programs along with the 150<sup>th</sup> celebration.

With the addition of the new programs, the budget had to be increased to support them. This does mean we had to increase the draw out of the endowments. As we discussed this, it was determined that we need to try new things now while we have the money to support the programs. If we wait until the endowment is depleted from supporting operating costs, we will not have the resources to be able to try new things. The goal of the new programs is to bring new people into the church to meet both their spiritual needs and meet our financial requirements.

With that being said, next year's budget is \$539,599 with \$281,000 coming from offerings and the remainder coming from the endowments. The budget has been presented to council for the first time in September and will be presented for approval in October. At that point a copy will be distributed to the congregation so they will have a chance to review before the annual meeting scheduled for Sunday, November 18<sup>th</sup>.

What we are in need of from the congregation:

- 1. Keep an open mind about future programs
- 2. Keep supporting the church both financially and by participating
- 3. Keep praying for the church and its leaders
